

The back-stack



- A task is a stack of Activities (or Fragments)
- As activities are started, they are arranged into a stack (the back-stack) within the task
- When activities are ended (think, the back-button), they are popped off of the stack

The back-stack

- Android can support running multiple tasks simultaneously
- Can bring tasks into the foreground, put into the background

Click through the stack



Change default stack behavior

- intent.addFlags(Intent.FLAG_ACTIVITY_SINGLE_TOP);
 - If task is already on BackStack, does not create new activity, but brings existing one to foreground. onNewIntent called.
- intent.addFlags(Intent.FLAG_ACTIVITY_NEW_(TASK/DOCUMENT));
 - Starts the activity in a NEW task, unless it is already running in another task. onNewIntent called.
- intent.addFlags(Intent.FLAG_ACTIVITY_CLEAR_TOP);
 - If task is already on BackStack, destroys other activities between top of stack and it. onNewIntent called.



Change the code to mimic this behavior

 When opening MainActivity, if it is on the top of the stack, should not create a new instance





Change the code to mimic this behavior


 When opening OtherActivity for the first time, should start up a new task, not just a new activity





Change the code to mimic this behavior

 When re-opening MainActivity, should clear all activities between the top and the previous active MainActivity





Track the onNewIntent Calls

 Change the app to that the count of calls to onNewIntent are tracked, per activity





Think of a practical use-case for:

- intent.addFlags(Intent.FLAG_ACTIVITY_SINGLE_TOP);
 - If task is already on BackStack, does not create new activity, but brings existing one to foreground. onNewIntent called.
